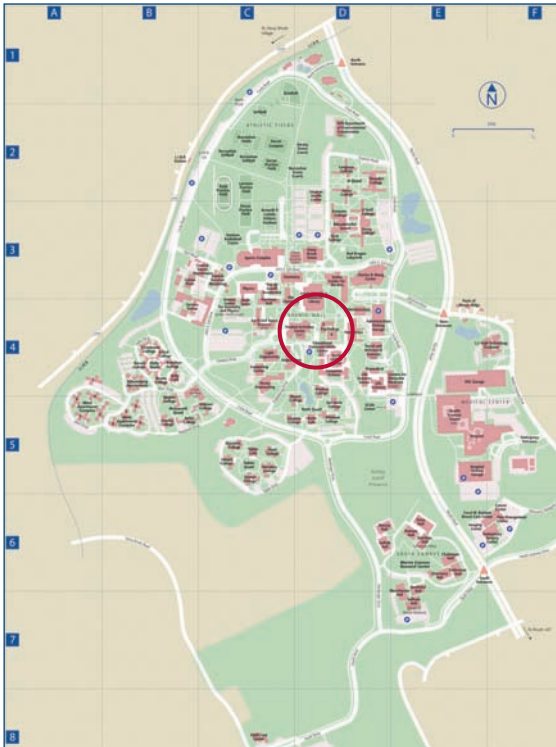


Directions

- Take the Long Island Expressway to Exit 62, Nicolls Road (CR 97).
- Travel approximately 8 miles, crossing Route 347.
- Turn left at the main entrance to the University and proceed to the traffic light.
- Turn right at the light onto Circle Road.
- Pass the Charles B. Wang Center and John S. Toll Drive on the left.
- Make the first right into the parking field, where special arrangements have been made for conference attendees to park.

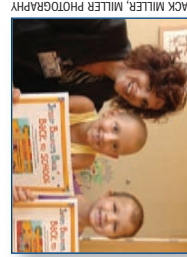
The Charles B. Wang Center is the large gray building with red entryway fencing, and is noted for the modern representation of a pagoda on the rooftop.

PATRICIA DUFFY, OP, PHD is a preacher and motivational speaker who developed WOMANSOUL, which provides programs for human development and soul enrichment for large groups of women and men across the tri-state area. She is a member of the Dominican Sisters of Amityville. She holds a MA in Religious Studies from Fordham University and a PhD in Human Development from The Union Institute and University. For her dissertation, Duffy studied 12 women for three years, using psychologist Abraham Maslow's hierarchy of values. Through the study of these women she discovered that courage, a sense of the possible, and a sense of humor were values essential to self-actualization that Maslow had not included in his hierarchy. Currently, she holds porch chats, teas, and retreats. Duffy approaches her life with the same kind of courage and humor she discovered in the women she studied for her dissertation.
