

## Information Regarding Research Involving Human Subjects

1. Does your proposed research involve human subjects or their data? See SBU's definition: <http://www.stonybrook.edu/vpadmin/policy/policies.shtml?ID=202>

If no, you can proceed with your research. No IRB oversight is required.
